














<u>"Game On" - Janat Evanovich -</u>

Summary "As an investigator for the Florida Board on Judicial Conduct, Lacy Stoltz sees plenty of corruption among the men and women elected to the bench. In The whistler, she took on a crime syndicate that was paying millions to a crooked judge.

Now, in "The Judge's List", the crimes are even worse. The man hiding behind the black robe is not taking bribes-but he may be taking lives."



"Billy Summers: A Novel" - Stephen King-

Summary: From legendary storyteller Stephen King, whose "restless imagination is a power that cannot be contained" (*The New York Times Book Review*), comes a thrilling new novel about a good guy in a bad job.

Billy Summers is a man in a room with a gun. He's a killer for hire and the best in the business. But he'll do the job only if the target is a truly bad guy. And now Billy wants out. But first there is one last hit. Billy is among the best snipers in the world, a decorated Iraq war vet, a Houdini when it comes to vanishing after the job is done. So what could possibly go wrong?


I also so enjoy the patrons, I've only been here a short while but I've met so many awesome people and I love that they love their Library!"


Q: If you weren't working at the Library and could be doing anything you wanted, what would you be doing?







