MEDICARE TO COVER WIDESPREAD USE OF ALZHEIMER'S DRUG

or the first time, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved for general use a drug found to slow the progress of Alzheimer's disease, opening the door for people over 65 in the early stages of the disease to have most of their expenses covered by Medicare.

The FDA has OK'd widespread use of the drug lecanemab, sold as Leqembi. Previously, the drug had been approved only for people participating in clinical trials. "This is a big deal," says Ronald Petersen, director of the Mayo Clinic Alzheimer's Disease Research Center. "We've been waiting for this kind of breakthrough for many, many years."

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services promised to pay a large share of the cost of taking the drug once the FDA issued its broad approval. Leqembi has a projected annual cost of \$26,500. That means patients with traditional Medicare or a typical Medicare Advantage plan, each of which covers 80 percent

of Part B drug costs, could still pay more than \$5,000 out of pocket annually to use the drug, says an estimate from KFF, a nonprofit health care research group.

The medication significantly reduced the amount of fibrous deposits known as amyloids in patients' brains, and slowed the loss of thinking and memory skills in people with early to mild Alzheimer's by 27 percent over an 18-month period.

"Today's action is the first verification that a drug targeting the underlying disease process of Alzheimer's disease has shown clinical benefit in this devastating disease," said Teresa Buracchio, acting director of the Office of Neuroscience at the FDA, when the approval was issued in July.

The drug is not for people already deeply affected by Alzheimer's, experts say.

The medication is given by intravenous infusion every two weeks at a hospital or medical center. Side effects ranged from flu-like symptoms to swelling and bleeding in the brain.



On Monday, September 11th, RSVP and the Belen Senior Center provided a school bus to transport seniors to the NM State Fair for Senior Day. The bus transported a total of 43 seniors to and from the fair. The NM State Fair had several vendors for seniors with information such as Presbyterian, NM Aging and Long-Term Services, Senior Olympics, AARP, along with the opportunity to get a flu shot.

Ask Stan Medicare Questions

Dear Stan

I recently signed up for Medicare Parts A and B. A friend said I should also consider purchasing a Medigap policy. What is a Medigap policy and why should I consider one?

The SMP will provide you with the information you need to PREVENT, DETECT and REPORT Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse.

Dear Samantha,

Congratulations on signing up for Medicare. Medicare pays on average about 80% of a beneficiary's medical costs. In addition to Medicare Parts A and B, seniors have the opportunity to buy a gap policy (Medicare Supplemental Insurance or Medigap) to cover the 20% difference in costs not paid by Original Medicare. It is important to note that Medigap policies do not offer additional benefits, they only pay the remaining 20% of costs. If Medicare pays, so does your Medigap, if Medicare denies a claim, your Medigap will not pay either. Also you cannot buy a Medigap policy if you have Medicare Advantage.

Medigap plans are sold by private insurance companies, and they can only sell you a "standardized" Medigap policy. There are 12 different policy types to

choose from. Each policy has a different set of standardized benefits covering Part A and B deductibles, coinsurances, copayments and in some cases foreign travel. To find out about the different Medigap types go to www.Medicare.gov:

- At the top of the page click on 'Health & Drug Plans'
- Under 'Find & Compare' click on 'Find a Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) policy'
- Do not enter your Zip Code
- To the right of 'Step 1' click on 'See benefits of each plan'

It's important to compare Medigap policies at different insurance companies because monthly premiums will vary. Generally, the only difference between Medigap policies sold by different insurance companies is the cost. The

rating'. Attained age rating' or an 'issue age rating'. Attained age rating means premiums will be lower when you are younger but can go up as you get older. Issue age rating means premiums are lower for younger buyers and will not go up as you get older.

To search for Medigap Plans and premiums go to www.Medicare.gov:

- At the top of the page click on 'Health & Drug Plans'
- Under 'Find & Compare' click on 'Find a Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) policy'
- Enter your Zip Code and click 'Start'
- Put in your age, sex and whether you smoke or not
- Select 'Update Prices'
- Sort through the alphabetical listings, select one of the standardized policy types to review
- Click on 'View Policies' and you will see the different insurance carriers and estimated monthly costs
- Contact the insurance carrier to get an official quote.

People who are just starting with Medicare have a Right of Guaranteed Issue period during which companies are not allowed to require a health screening or deny a beneficiary based on pre-existing conditions. If you initially opt for a Medicare Advantage plan and later decide Original Medicare with a Medigap would better suit your needs, you will have a Right of Guaranteed Issue only if you are in the first year of Medicare. However, if you try to enroll in a Medigap policy when you do not have a Right of Guaranteed Issue you may have trouble finding a plan that will accept you.



Chicken Rice Skillet

Prep/Total Time: 30 min. Makes: 4 servings

Ingredients

4 boneless skinless chicken breast halves (4 ounces each)

2 tbsp. canola oil

2 celery ribs, chopped

4 green onions, thinly sliced

½ cup chopped sweet red pepper

½ cup chopped sweet yellow

pepper

2 cups frozen green beans, thawed

1 jar (4-1/2 ounces) sliced mushrooms, drained

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) chicken broth

¼ cup water

3 garlic cloves, minced

½ tsp salt

¼ tsp lemon-pepper seasoning

1/8 tsp garlic powder 1/8 tsp pepper


2 cups uncooked instant rice

Directions

- 1. In a large skillet, cook chicken over medium heat in oil for 3-4 minutes on each side or until a thermometer reads 165 degrees. Remove from pan; keep warm. Add the celery, onions and peppers; cook until vegetables are crisp -tender. Stir in beans and mushrooms until heated through.
- 2. Stir in the broth, water, garlic, and seasonings. Bring to a boil. Stir in rice; cover and remove from the heat. Let stand for 5 minutes or until rice is tender; fluff with a fork. To serve, top rice mixture with chicken breasts.



What's new & important?



Medicare strives to improve access to affordable treatments to keep you healthy. Check out what's new this year to help you manage your health.

Saving money on your prescription drugs

Starting January 1, 2024, if you have Medicare drug coverage (Part D) and your drug costs are high enough to reach the catastrophic coverage phase, you don't have to pay a copayment or coinsurance. Extra Help—a program that helps cover your Part D drug costs—will expand to cover more drug costs for certain people with limited resources and income. Go to pages 83 and 92.

Coinsurance amounts for some Part B-covered drugs may be less if a prescription drug's price increased higher than the rate of inflation. Go to page 40.

Lower costs for insulin and vaccines

Your Medicare drug plan **can't charge you more than \$35** for a one-month supply of each insulin product Part D covers, and you don't have to pay a deductible for it. Go to page 88.

If you take insulin through a traditional pump that's covered under Medicare's durable medical equipment benefit, that insulin is covered under Medicare Part B. You won't pay more than \$35 for a month's supply and the Medicare deductible no longer applies. Go to pages 39 and 88.

Recommended adult vaccines are also now available at no cost to you. Go to page 50.

Changes to telehealth coverage

You can still get telehealth services at any location in the U.S., including your home, until the end of 2024. After that, you must be in an office or medical facility located in a rural area to get most telehealth services. There are some exceptions, like for mental health services. Go to page 51.

Managing and treating chronic pain

Medicare now covers monthly services to treat chronic pain if you've been living with it for more than 3 months. Go to page 34.

Better mental health care

Starting January 1, 2024, Medicare will cover intensive outpatient program services provided by hospitals, community mental health centers, and other locations if you need mental health care. Go to pages 46-47.

More times to sign up for Medicare

If you recently lost (or will soon lose) Medicaid, you may be able to sign up for Medicare or change your current Medicare coverage. There are other special situations that allow you to sign up for Medicare. Go to page 18.

COVID-19 care

Medicare continues to cover the COVID-19 vaccine, and several tests and treatments to keep you and others safe. Go to page 37.
